The Saturday conservation sessions have temporarily stopped due to logistic challenges. We hope to restart them soon.


Message from the Chairperson

I have just finalised the volunteer hours for last year and, as you may expect, it is another record. 11,749 hours bringing the total since we started volunteering in 2013 to 32,399. As the National Minimum wage of is around £10 per hour this means we have contributed significantly to the hall and park land.
