## **Formal Garden**

Volunteers, supported by FoWP have worked with the park staff over the last 4 years on the maintenance of the Formal Garden. Due to council budget controls, some adjustments to the usual planting have had to be made this year. The vibrant summer bedding displays you might be accustomed to seeing will be a little less extensive. The border along the

camellia house has been planted with cottage-garden style perennials but they will not mature until next year. The other formal beds still contain our spring



bedding and being made to look the best they can with maintenance from the Wednesday volunteers. Discussions are underway with Park Rangers to explore alternative planting options for the future. FoWP and the Council are committed to keeping this space a source of beauty and interest throughout the year.

Message from Kevin Beswick, Chair of FoWP...

As you may know the Friends of Wollaton Park is in its 11th year and in that time we have always had an active committee group. Three members who have been on the committee from those early days are Moyra Cornish, Peter Forster, and Mark Jacobs. They have decided to step down this year and I want to pay tribute to all three.



Moyra has spent countless hours selling cards to raise funds, helped at many volunteer sessions, organised a fashion show and helped with the Wollaton Arts Festival. Moyra and her late husband Michael were instrumental in laying the

foundations and making the group the success it is today.

Mark, a former chair of the group has applied his skills to collecting photographs and making the cards, helping at tasks sessions, and joining in at the Walled Garden Group. Mark also contributed significantly to



the Wollaton Arts Festival. He has been partly responsible for our healthy bank balance over the years.



Finally, **Peter**, a former chair of the group, has given freely of his time, knowledge, and experience as a former member of staff at Wollaton Hall. He has led informative tours of both the Walled Garden and the Hall helping to raise funds for our group.

He is passionate about all things connected to the park regularly voicing his opinions to ensure that the park is a better place for all. However, he has devoted most of his energy to encouraging the community of volunteers in the Walled Garden and it would not be what it is today if it was not for his efforts and good humour.

It goes without saying that these three will leave a legacy and a void as they step down but I know they will be supporting us from the wings. #### Deer

New research from University College Dublin reveals that feeding deer is causing serious health and behavioural issues for these beautiful animals. Key findings show:

- Health Problems: Deer are developing digestive issues and even testing positive for human viruses like Omicron.
- Behavioural Changes: Feeding disrupts their natural habits, causing stress and danger for both deer and park visitors.
- Physical Impact: Stags are growing weaker antlers and does are birthing larger fawns, posing risks for their health.

Other research has shown why feeding deer ultimately causes the deer to die from being unable to eat due to rotten teeth.
